SBPC Sermon-Based Small Groups Week of October 1, 2006 Be Different: Living the Ethics of Jesus Part 3: Be Influential—Matthew 5:13-16

REFLECT ON IT - Personal preparation prior to Small Group meeting

- Take time to slowly and meditatively read Matthew 5:13-16. Try each of the following exercises at separate times. Each time identifying a different situation.
- Visualize a specific area of darkness in your life and imagine what it would look like illuminated by the light of Christ. Invite Christ into that situation to dispel the darkness.
- Visualize an area of darkness in our world and pray for God to use you as a light. Pray for your ability to shine the light of truth into that place as an influence for Christ.

START IT – Connecting with each other

- Who has been the greatest influence in your life (besides Jesus)? How?
- What brought you to this church? How long have you been here?

STUDY IT - Matthew 5:3-12 - Read the passage aloud

- What new insights have you gained from this week's scripture or message?
- How are the Beatitudes related to Jesus' words about salt and light? Identify one situation where applying a Beatitude would produce "salt" and "light."
- What is the difference between your "light" and your "good deeds"?
- How does being a light compliment being salt?
- Read the D. Bruner and T. Kelly quotes aloud. How do they support this week's Scripture? Do you think our church is "really willing" to let God break in and influence us?
- Read the SBPC Core Belief Statement on Mission. In what way are you (or would you like to) "participate in the work of ministry and mission"? How can you encourage one another to explore new opportunities of service?

LIVE IT - Applying the truth of Scripture to life

- Make plans with your group to do a "salt and light" project. Check out the service opportunities on the SBPC Small Group website, or find one of your own.
- It is easier to study God's word than to put it into practice. In groups of three (not spouse) share: how are you doing at being salt and light (honestly)?
- Share a specific situation in your life where you could be an influence. How is your life currently an influence for ministry and mission? Commit to praying for one another every day this week.

PRAY IT – Supporting one another through care and prayer

- Application: Ask for God's help in applying today's passage to your life.
- **Ministry (within the church):** Pray for the All Church Retreat Team as they prepare all the various aspects of the retreat. Pray that this would be an extraordinary experience of community for our church.
- Mission (in the world): Pray for the Melkonians in Morocco. It's Ramadan, a month where they will be invited to many celebrations at the homes of Muslim neighbors who fast during the day and feast at night. Pray for opportunities to share the hope of Christ.
